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Four members from the Singapore National Youth Orchestra (SNYO) comprising Claudia, Alex, Mi Yo and I, participated in a two-week long youth orchestra camp organised by the National Symphony Orchestra, Taiwan. The National Symphony Youth Orchestra (NSYO) Summer Camp was held between 14 to 26 July 2023, consisting of intensive rehearsals in the first week followed by the concert tour in 5 locations around Taiwan in the second week.

We first had to pass the audition in January this year, then upon successful entry to the NSYO camp, flew to Taiwan in July to start rehearsals. This was my first time going on an orchestra tour and it was also the first ever youth orchestra camp organised by the National Symphony Orchestra (also known as the Taiwan Philharmonic).
